

Thought for the Week

Thanksgiving, Joy, Partnership in the Gospel & The Day of Christ

In Paul's letter to the Philippians we see four central themes; thanksgiving, joy, partnership in the gospel and the day of Christ.

I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus. (Philippians 1:3-6)

Despite his imprisonment, Paul prays with thankfulness and joy, as he remembers their partnership in the gospel. He celebrates that as a church they are working together to see people saved! In verse 6 we see that salvation is God's work! From start to finish God is the one who works in us and therefore all the thanks and glory go to God!

Finally Paul points them (and us) to the truth that one day Jesus is coming back! Paul's letter is written with one eye on Jesus' return; a truth and hope we can cling onto with all our strength. In these days of Covid-19, we long for Christ to return and make all things new. In the meantime we can pray with joy and thanksgiving and ask God to draw more people to himself made possible by the death and resurrection of Jesus.
