We are thankful to Grace Pearson and Grace Matthews who have been leading our scramblers program which runs alongside Jr Church on a Sunday morning. Scramblers is for parents to come with children aged 18 months - 3, before they join Jr Church. This is often the first place new families with young children attend, who are thinking about or who have had their children baptised.

### Youth

At youth on a Sunday afternoon, we are going through the Lord's Prayer from Matthew 6. We are exploring line by line, and thinking about what it means and where else the topic is found in the bible. We are hoping to have 2 sessions at the end of the term aimed at inviting our friends who would not normally attend, and have 2 short talks and a discussion on questions they might have on the Christian faith.
